

In Case of an Emergency Call 911

Keep Your Home Safe

Keep all doors and windows **locked**

Exterior doors should be solid core or metal

A **good quality deadbolt** with a minimum of a one inch throw should be used on all exterior doors

If using a double cylinder deadbolt, be sure to keep a key readily available in case of an emergency

Use a **heavy duty strike plate** secured with number 12 gauge three-inch wood screws

Exit doors with outside hinges should have their hinges pinned

Install a peephole with at least a 180-degree viewing area

Secure sliding glass doors with an anti-lifting device and a secondary locking device

Install **secondary locking devices** on all windows

Place **outside lights** high and out of reach

Install **lights** around **doors, walkways, and driveways**

Use **automatic timers** for interior and exterior **lights**

Use **landscaping** to deter burglars

Keep **shrubs and trees trimmed** so doors and windows are visible from the street

Plant thorny hostile plants along fences and windows

Do not leave ladders or tools outside, these can be used to assist a suspect in gaining entry into your home

Gates should be **locked** with a good quality **padlock**

Install large **reflective numbers** on your home and mailbox so **police** and other **emergency** personnel can locate your home

Install a home security system

Choose a **reputable, well established company**

Become familiar with the **operation of your alarm system** to reduce false alarms

Do not write your alarm code on or near the alarm system

Put **alarm company warning signs** on windows

Keep your **alarm registration** and information **up to date**

Acknowledge all callers, known and unknown, through locked doors

Re-key or **change locks** on all exterior doors when moving into a new home

Change the code to the **garage door** when moving into a new home

Keep all **curtains** or **shades closed**

Do not leave house keys in obvious location such as a mailbox, under plants or doormats

Know your neighbors and be aware of **suspicious persons**

Keep Your Vehicle Safe

Lock all doors & **close** windows

Remove all **valuables** and **packages** from sight, **even if only away from the vehicle for a few moments**

Park in a **well-lit, high visibility** area

Place **valuables** in the **trunk** before arriving to your destination

Watch for **suspicious activity**, such as people looking in vehicle windows or checking door handles

Install a car **alarm**
